


Hottenstein Reunion Picnic, at the Watsontown (PA) Municipal Park

Tiles and Mugs, New Hottenstein Memorabilia

Ceramic tiles and porcelain mugs will newly be available at the Reunion this year. On this special occasion of the 70th Hottenstein Reunion, arrangements are made to reproduce the Coat of Arms on ceramic tiles or porcelain mugs for long lasting use.

The tiles are ceramic, 6"x6" in format, and are available in either a glossy or matte finish. Each tile is individually fired, using a hand applied image transfer process. Being glazed, the image is fixed forever. The tile may be used as a trivet for hot or cold dishes or alternatively be used a wall hanging. The price is \$18.00 each.

The mugs are porcelain and will contain 14 fl oz. As with the tile, each mug is individually fired using a hand applied image transfer process. This mug with the Hottenstein Coat of Arms is suitable for many uses, in addition to coffee times. The price is \$19.00 each.

Journey to Ittlingen, Baden-Wurttenberg, Germany

In May 2006, Larry Herlacher and his wife, Jane, drove 30 miles northwest of Stuttgart. With hills on our left we turned right, over a train track, then a bridge crossing a rivulet into Ittlingen. From here it is believed the Hottensteins traveled to America. The Rathaus [town hall] stands in the town's center where the community water pump still remains.

Nearby we discovered a restored Protestant church, a building dated 1807 with an inner courtyard, an excellent restaurant "Goldener Kafer" [Golden Beetle], and intriguing shops. A small industrial area edged the railroad. About five blocks uphill were new homes, adjoining cultivated fields. Upon leaving we passed some children and wondered if they were our cousins!

The William Hottenstein Family History Available through Custom Binding

At the request of several family members, printing of the extensive history of the descendents of William Hottenstein, second generation continues. Arrangements have been made with a different bindery for the assembly of additional books. We now have casings prepared for the binding of just 6 more books.

The book, replicated in its original format, contains a personalization page bound into the book, which can be formatted for gift or family orientation. Orders may be made on the attached reservation form or initiated at the Reunion on July 16th, or subsequently by contacting Terry Schnure. Orders received by August 1st will be the basis for the additional wave to be assembled by the bindery. Due to the printing and binding expense, only those orders for books received will be prepared. The cost of the book is \$94, which includes shipping.
